# Context of Writing

Published in 1927-post WW1

• During war, role of women changed: increased rights over property, education, local politics, marriage/divorce

- "sweated industries"-long work hours and low wages
- o Social evils and authority over subjects
- Gender roles and marital entrenchment

- o The Lighthouse-post WW1



# Key Quotes

- "...at the very moment when it was painful to be reminded of the inadequacy of human relationships, that the most perfect was flawed..." (40).
  - Everything that looks beautiful is flawed
  - Resembles Woolf's vision of the world- no matter how beautiful it is, it is still destroyed
- "When darkness fell, the stroke of the Lighthouse... came now in the softer light of spring mixed with moonlight gliding gently as if it laid its caress and lingered stealthily and looked and and came lovingly again" (132-133).
  - Shows the consistency of the Lighthouse and the support it offers to the onlookers
  - Guides them home
